

Examples: Table rentals for the show have increased from \$2,700 to \$3,900 since our last show. Postage has gone up, facility rental is up, supplies have gone up....you know the sad story.

As a result, starting on January 1, 2023, we are going to have to increase our fees a bit.

Pte. William Burnet 2987790 -5/7 Gordon Highlanders (Sniper) Killed in Action June 18, 1944

While setting up a display at a local Nashville show, I was approached by a beautiful sweet lady who asked me about the value of some WW2 British medals. I explained to her that most are fairly common in the \$10-25 range. I then asked her about the story behind her medals. She explained to me that they were her fathers and she inherited them after her mother had passed away. I asked her why she wanted to sell them and I was suddenly hit with an interesting but very sad story.

She explained that she had no children to pass them onto and that she was also an only child. She had never met her biological father because unfortunately he died before she was born, (Killed in Action). Her father had landed on D-Day (June 6, 1944) and was killed June 18, 1944 on the way towards Caen.

This grouping is now one of the most prized possessions in my collection.

Before landing in Normandy, Private Burnet served in North Africa and Italy, earning battle stars from each campaign. On June 6, 1944 he landed on the Normandy beach (code name Sword) between Courseulles and Ouistreham, France. On 7 June, he moved to the Pegasus Bridge area in support of the 6th British Airborne who had captured the bridge on the morning of the 6th. (this event was highlighted in the movie; The Longest Day) On the 9th of June, Pte. Burnet and the 5/7 Gordons crossed the Pegasus bridge and started to make their way towards Caen. They came to an wooded area just east of Escoville and north of Touffreville, called Bois de Bavent forest. The Germans were sniping and spotting artillery from the Brickwork towers near Touffreville. Pvt. Burnet was a unit sniper and so he and a few other snipers moved forward to observe and possibly neutralize any opposition ahead. Shortly after moving forward, a German artillery shell landed on them and 3 were killed instantly while another died later of his wounds. Pvt. Burnet was unfortunately one of those who died instantly.

A letter, dated February 17, 1945, written by the Battalion Liaison Officer of the 5/7 Gordon Highlanders explained what happened:

5/7 Gordon Highlanders B.L.A.17.2.45

Dear Mr. Sanderson,

Ref. Query from Pte. Burnet's '90 (of our unit) wife. Be it about six of our snipers had gone out on 18 June to the forward edge of our positions on the Orne bridgehead in Normandy. This area was wooded. A shell hit the spot where they were standing and 3 died instantly, 1 died later of wounds and 2 survived. The next night at 11:00 o'clock, I buried the remains of the lads in a clearing in the woods. There are eight of our graves in all.

This wood is called Bois de Bavent and is about 6 miles inland from the beaches at grays -su- (near-Ouistreham) where we landed on "D" day. It was the extreme left British flank save for the airborne Division. It is on the way to Caen, about 8 miles from it. I notified the graves commission of the whereabouts of the grave. In due course they will lift the grave and move it to a military cemetery, assuming if they have not already done so. The location and photographs will be sent Ms. Burnet. If she can inform me which graves Registration unit she contacted I shall then contact them. This sacrifice has not been in vain. Nonetheless his death is a loss not only to Ms. Burnet, but to us and the nation. There were a very few belongings of his which should arrive from G.H.Q. 2nd Echelon in due course.

I shall be pleased to provide any other information.



Staff Sergeant Ryan Knauss 7 APR 98 - 20 AUG 21

Tennessee loses one of it's own. Last solider to die in Afghanistan.



TMCA honors Staff Sgt. Ryan C. Knauss, who was assigned to 9th Battalion, 8th Psychological Operations Group (Airborne), and died as a result of wounds sustained from an attack at the Hamid Karzai International Airport, where he was supporting noncombatant evacuation operations on Aug. 26,

2021, in Kabul, Afghanistan. Knauss was a native of **Corryton, Tennessee**.

Knauss joined the U.S. Army in May 2016. Following Initial Entry Training and Airborne

School at Fort Benning, Georgia, Knauss was assigned to 2nd Battalion, 501st Infantry Regiment, 82nd Airborne Division, and deployed to Afghanistan in 2017 as an infantryman. Upon returning home, Knauss completed the Psychological Operations Assessment and Selection Course and the Psychological Operations Qualification Course was assigned to 9th Battalion, 8th Psychological Operations Group (Airborne).
