

Recently a nice lady sold me an A2 jacket that she had purchased years prior at a yard sale in Springfield, TN. It was not named. With a little research, it did not take long to discover who the owner of the jacket was.





It started with a Google search on all the mission targets listed on the jacket. I quickly found that the 398th BG, flew these same missions in the exact same order. I then concentrated on the last mission over Delitzsch on 8-16-44. I looked on-line at all the 398th Bomb Groups tour

completion records and I noticed that in the 398th BG. 603rd BS, there were 7 guys who finished that day and only one of them, SSgt. Hinkle, had exactly 25 missions. Another quick search on Ancestor and I found that SSgt Hinckle was



from Springfield, TN, the same location as to were the jacket was originally discovered. Further research suggested that "The Tennessean" painted on the jacket was Dwight's nickname, not the name on a B-17.

Lt. Charles C. Bragg, Pilot L-19 I Corps Artillery, Korean War

Charles Bragg was born on 18 December 1928 in Hartford City, IN. His parents were Carl A. Bragg and Helen Cady Bragg.

Charles completed is Reserve Officer Training Corps on 18 June 1949 and Coastal Artillery Corps Training on 1 June 1950. He joined the US Army on 20 February 1951 as a Senior Army Aviation Officer. He retired on 18 December



1988 as a Lieutenant Colonel. His military career included three tours of duty, one in Japan and two in Korea. Charles was a Commander of the 4th Howitzer Battalion of the US Army's Artillery Regiment. He was a highly decorated Officer receiving the Silver Star,

Air Medal with three oak leaf clusters for flying 140 reconnaissance missions over enemy territory contributing directly to the successful accomplishments of those combat missions. Additionally he was awarded the Korean Service Medal with three Bronze Stars and the United Nations Service Medal.

Following his active duty in the Army and while a reservist. Charles went back to school and earned a business degree from Michigan State University. He was married to Marlene Thomas Bragg and passed away on 12 December 1988.

Charles was awarded the Silver Star for gallantry in action near Majong-Dong, Korea on 28 March 1953. Here are excerpts from the award document.

Lt Bragg volunteered to fly his L-19 aircraft low over a large concentration of active enemy anti-aircraft artillery deep within enemy territory so as to decoy the crews into the open in order that they might be destroyed by the I Corps Artillery. Due to the extreme hazards involved with this mission he flew without an observer. Despite the intense anti-aircraft fire being directed at him, approximately 5,000 rounds Lt. Bragg piloted his airplane over this concentration at a low altitude of 4,000 to 6,500 feet five times to ensure maximum damage to the enemy. He succeeded in decoying about 36 of the enemy weapons out into the open. By this act Lt. Bragg was responsible for the



destruction of approximately 20 enemy antiaircraft weapons Korean War era Theater made Patch. I Corps Forward Air Control.

and the killing or wounding of their crews. This mission so neutralized the enemy in the vicinity that I Corps Artillery aircraft could again fly over the area and conduct aerial surveillance and direction of artillery fire so vital to the supported infantry divisions. The enemy could no longer move troops and supplies through this area with impunity.

Note: The early pin-back Army Aviators badge. This wing was approved on July 27, 1950. It replaced the standard AAC pilots wing because the original AAC pilots wing was transferred to the newly formed US Air Force in 1947.







The "SOUVENIR KING" Pvt. John (Barney) Hines

John "Barney" Hines, nicknamed "The Souvenir King" (1878–1958) was a British-born Australian 45th Battalion soldier of World War 1 known for his prowess at taking items from German soldiers.



Hines was the subject of a famous photo taken by Frank Hurley that depicted him surrounded by German military equipment and money he had looted during the Battle of Polygon Wood in September 1917.

This image (left-colorized) is among the best-known Australian photographs of the war. He is counting money stolen from prisoners of war, wearing a German Army field cap and sitting amidst Ger-

> man weapons and personal equipment.



After the war, Hines lived in poverty on the outskirts of Sydney until his death in 1958.
