#### Visit to the Queensland Museum and Mephisto

In April of 2024 I was fortunate to take a trip with my wife to visit our son who was conducting missionary work in Australia. As we were on our way to depart, we were able to go to the Queensland Museum in Brisbane and visit their World War One exhibit which featured the only surviving German A7V tank from the war.

#### History of the A7V

The German Army started designing their own armored fighting vehicle, the A7V Sturmpanzerwagen after the British fielded their own tanks in 1916. 20 of the A7V's were manufactured before the end of the war. They saw limited service on the Western Front in 1918. Number 506, "Mephisto" is the only surviving vehicle of the 20 manufactured.



Number 506 was part of the first German army "Sturmpanzerkraftwagen" detachment (Unit 1). Most of the tanks in this unit, bore a white skull-and-crossbones on the front armor plating beneath the main gun. The tanks were often named by their crews and the names were painted on their hulls.

Tank 506 was painted with the figure of Mephistopheles, the red, smiling Faustian demon, on the upper front left armor plate. Tucked under the demon's arm was a rhomboid-shaped British tank. The original skull-and-crossbones was overpainted with a single cross pattée, or German cross. This same black and white cross was repeated prominently on both sides of the tank. It was named Mephisto, in honor of its demon decoration.

Mephisto participated in its first ever battle at St Quentin on 21 March 1918. Its second battle came at Villers-Bretonneux on 24 April 1918. In that attack it became stranded in a shell crater, and was later recovered from the battlefield by men of the Australian Infantry Forces and members of the Royal Army.

Brought to Australia in 1919 as a war trophy, Mephisto has been housed at the Queensland Museum in Brisbane ever since. Mephisto's current paint scheme was applied by the Queensland Museum in 1988. Eighteen of the original 20 A7Vs produced by Germany survived the war more or less intact. However, most were scrapped in the years immediately following the Armistice. No. 506, Mephisto is the world's only remaining example.

Crew - 18 members. Weight - 30 Tons. Speed - 10 kph

Armament – one 57mm Nordenfelt Cannon, six Maxim water cooled machineguns.





#### Our Visit to the Queensland Museum and Mephisto

We spent our last day in Australia in Brisbane going to the Queensland Museum, mainly to see Mephisto. It was definitely worth the effort. This is probably the most impressive and rare piece of WW1 history that I have ever seen.

The museum has an excellent large screen interactive presentation which shows overall views of the whole vehicle plus interior details. It also shows the crew and their stations. The whole experience around the tank is great with additional displays of Queenslanders in the war in the same area. If you are ever in Brisbane, please spend a few hours and go see the only surviving German tank from World War 1.

One final suggestion, if you visit the museum, go to the gift shop. There are several books on Mephisto including an excellent 350+ page history of the A7V tank. They also have magnets, toys, postcards, and T-shirts featuring the Mephisto mascot painting on the front.


